

Nugget Purse¹ and Backpack

Supplies

Double-sided paper (or cardstock)
Cardstock scrap in a coordinating color
Cutting Kit (scoring wheel) or bone folder
Ruler or straight edge
Tag corner punch
1/16" circle hand punch
1/2" circle punch
Rectangle hand punch (for backpack pattern only)
a beige or brown Classic Stampin' Pad: Creamy Caramel,
Close to Cocoa, or Chocolate Chip
Stamps and other ink colors (optional)
Brads (diamond brad from Vintage Brads shown)
Grosgrain ribbon
SNAIL adhesive
Mini Glue Dots
Hershey's® Nuggets chocolate candy



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Instructions

- Cut cardstock to 1-3/8" x 4-1/2". *Hint when making multiples: Cut cardstock to 4-1/2" wide, score the entire piece of cardstock at lengths indicated, then cut into 1-3/8 strips.*
- Using bone folder or scoring wheel from the Cutting Kit and a ruler to score at 3/4", 1", 2-1/4", and 3-1/4"
- Stamp if desired. If using patterned paper, skip this step.
- Fold on each score mark in the same direction with the pattern you prefer on the outside. Unfold.
- Use the tag corner punch on the side with the shorter flap. This will be the flap of your purse or backpack.
- Distress paper edges by applying brown or beige stamp pad direct-to-paper.
- For purse: place a small amount of adhesive (or mini glue dots) on each end of a 4" strip of ribbon. Glue ribbon to inside of purse where the small fold is. Fold and glue flap so that the paper is in the shape of a purse.
- For backpack: glue flap with a small amount of adhesive so that paper is in the final shape. Using rectangle hand punch, punch a hole in each of the four corners of the back side of the backpack (rectangular holes should be horizontal when the backpack is standing up). Glue the ends of two 4" strips of ribbon and thread ribbon through holes, adhering ribbon edges to inside of backpack.
- Using 1/16" circle hand punch, punch a small hole near bottom of flap. Set aside.
- Using 1/16" circle hand punch, punch a small hole in a separate piece of cardstock, about 1/2" from any edges. Using 1/2" circle punch (upside down so that you can see what you're punching), make sure small hole is centered in the circle and punch so that you create a one-hole button.
- Insert brad through center hole of paper button and hole through flap on front of purse or backpack, and secure.
- Apply 1 or 2 mini glue dots to the bottom of your Hershey's® Nugget, slide the chocolate inside your purse or backpack and secure.
